- \$25 Room air conditioner (with no proof of disposal)

Purchases must be made between January 1, 2018 and December 31, 2018 and all rebate requests must be postmarked no later than January 31, 2019

Energy Saving Tips



Don't pay for air conditioning when you're at work. Set your thermostat at a comfortable level using a programmable thermostat that can be programmed for different temperatures at different times of the day.

Energy-saving light bulbs are more efficient, last longer, and use less power which helps save month on your electric bill and reduce the amount of heat generated. Energy-saving light bulbs fit most standard fixtures, but if you have an old fixture that won't fit an energy-saving bulb, consider switching the light to a lower wattage. It's ok to use lower wattage bulbs, but using a higher wattage bulb than is required is a fire

Don't avoid using your dishwasher because you think it will save money. It's cheaper to run a full load of dishes in the dishwasher than to wash the same amount of dishes by hand. Always run the dishwasher with a full load and avoid rinsing prior to loading. If you can, run the dishwasher to wash only and then leave the door open to air dry or dry by hand. You should only run your dishwasher at night during the summer months.
